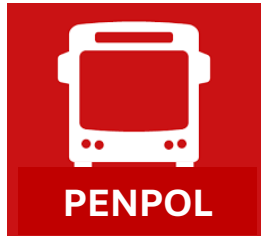

Passing places – please don't park in them!

We've had complaints lately from residents about vehicles parking in the passing places, especially on the Tram Road and the problems this causes when meeting other vehicles along the Tram. New notices will soon be being put up in the passing places and we hope this will make people who are not local aware that these areas are passing places and not parking spaces.

Rogue Traders and doorstep callers

There have been reports recently across the Parish of door step callers who residents feel are over pricing for work and using pressurised selling methods. Cornwall Council's advice to report a rogue trader is:

If you have evidence of a scam operating in your area, or you are worried about a doorstep trader Cornwall Council would like to hear from you. Their advice is:

- Don't confront them.
- Just get as much information as you can, such as:
 - vehicle description and registration number, business name, what they are selling or the work they are doing, dates and times of the visit, keep hold of any fliers / leaflets they may have given you
- Then email tradingstandards@cornwall.gov.uk or call 0300 1234 191.

Just a reminder that in Devoran Community Library based at the Parish Council Office we have recycling collection points for both domestic batteries and also pill blister packs which are then taken to Superdrug for recycling.

You can also recycle your old wetsuit now at your local Household Waste & Recycling Centre – the closest to the parish are the centres at Longdowns or by the Park and Ride in Truro by Waitrose.

Outdoor spaces in the Parish

There are lots of outdoor public spaces and facilities in the Parish, some of which are provided by the Parish Council and some by other organisations, we have listed the majority of them below. There's also a map showing roughly where they are in the parish in case anyone wants to go and visit any of them.

Devoran Recreation Ground, St John's Terrace, Devoran

Facilities: Wooden tower play equipment, Sammy seal rocker, flat swings and birds nest swing, slide, football goal and kick about space. On street parking. No dogs please.



Park an Gwarry Children's Play Park, Bissoe Road, Carnon Downs

Facilities: Wooden pirate ship, tractor slide, flat and cradle swings and birds nest swing, slide and basketball hoop. On street parking, no dogs please.

Pengelly Meadows Recreation Area, Bissoe Road, Carnon Downs

Facilities: Outdoor gym, football area and goals, table tennis table. On street parking, no dogs please.



Retallack Playing Field, Feock

Facilities: Outdoor gym, football area and goals, basket ball hoop, mini trampoline, cone spinner, zip wire, wooden tower, flat and cradle swings. Small car park. No dogs please. No overnight parking or camping.



Dyson's Field, Tram Road between Devoran and Point

The Parish Council own this area of land which was gifted by the Dyson Family for the community to enjoy. It is planted with local species of trees and wildflowers and will eventually become a woodland. Members of the public are welcome to enjoy it and stop off when using the Tram Road, dogs to be kept on a lead please, no parking. A bike rack will be installed shortly. There are signs at the entrance to the field.



Restronguet Point Common Land, Feock

Facilities: Bench seats and view of the creek. Dinghy storage. No parking.

Carnon Yard, Feock

Facilities: Bench seats and view of the creek. Boat storage. No parking.

Common Land at Carnon Mine, Tram Road

Facilities: Bench seats and view of the creek. Boat storage. Bird watching. No parking.

Point Quay*, Orchard* and Point Green

Leased to Point Quay Association*. Facilities: Bench seats and view of the creek. On street parking.

Jubilee Wood (not Parish Council owned or managed)

Jubilee Wood is a public space in Carnon Downs next to the Carnon Inn, which the landowner has kindly opened up for public use.

Devoran Quay (not Parish Council owned or managed)

Owned and managed by Devoran Quay Preservation Society

Outdoor gyms – Carnon Downs & Feock

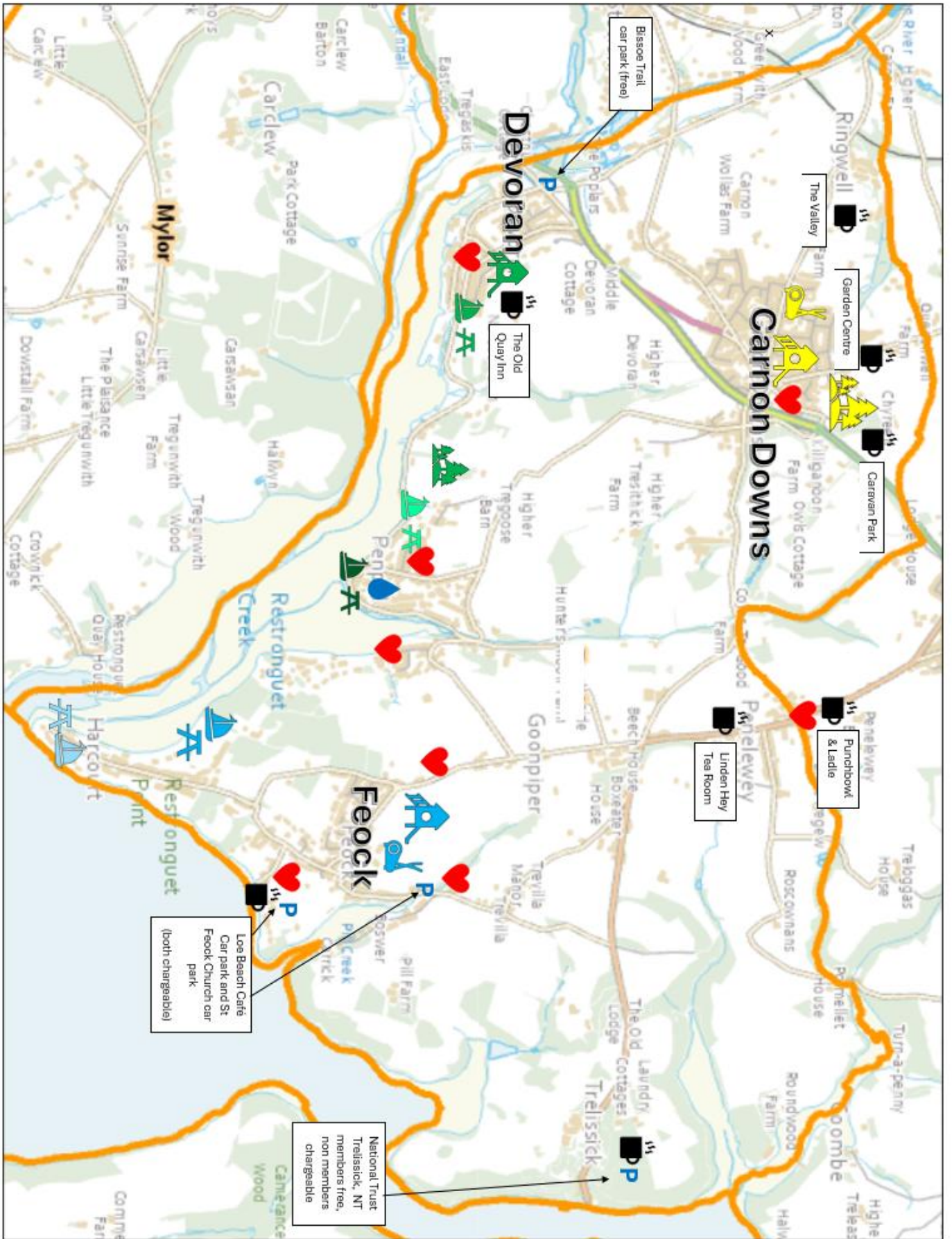
We have two outdoor free to use gyms in the parish, in Pengelly Meadows Recreation Area, Carnon Downs and Retallack Playing Field in Feock. The equipment is not just your run-of-the-mill outdoor gym items, this is state-of-the-art hydraulic equipment with adjustable settings, meaning you can pedal, push and stretch whatever your ability as you can set the resistance at your level.

The range of equipment at both sites allows users to exercise all of the main core muscle groups as well as undertaking cardio-vascular workouts enabling all abilities to exercise at a pace suitable for them and to increase the difficulty as their fitness improves.

We ask for a donation from the person having the lift towards running the cost of the scheme and to cover the volunteers petrol.

Active Feock Update

Active Feock commissioned a feasibility study to look at the priorities of the community and the health service for the project. This aims to improve the communication network within the parish and to make the improved pathways interesting and enhanced corridors for wildlife. The overall purpose is to support and enhance the well being of residents.

The feasibility study report is due at the time of writing and it is expected that a full explanation of the findings will be published in the next issue of Connect. The report will be published on the Council website and comments from the public will be welcomed as part of the consultation process.

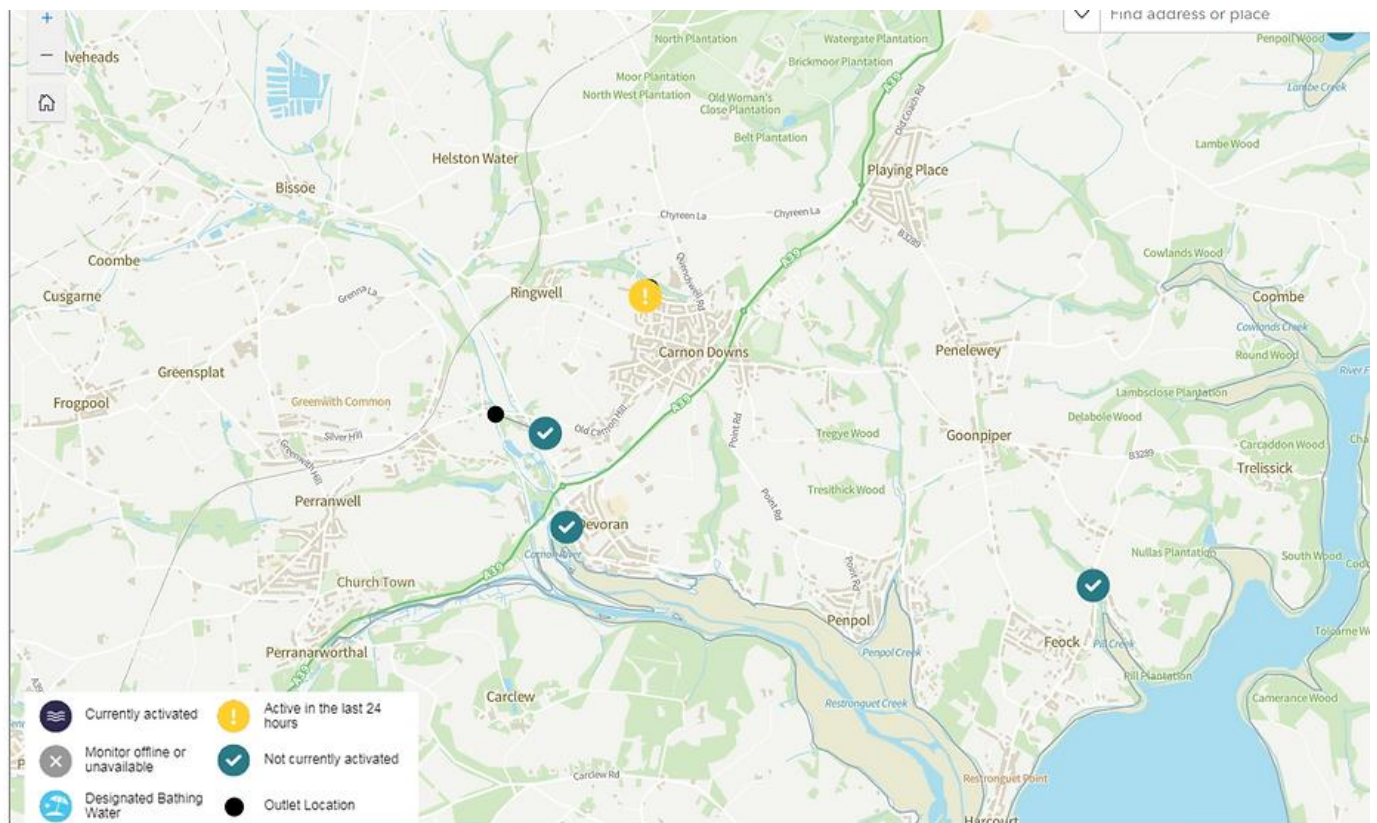
The next meetings of the Parish Council are on Monday 9th September (Full Council) and Monday 23rd September (Access & Amenities Committee) at 6pm.

South West Water Overflow mapping

This is a useful tool on the SWW website, updated daily and shows when there has been storm overflow from pumping stations and the last time there was an overflow and where it flows into.

The 'tick' shows not currently activated, the yellow exclamation mark where there has been overflow in the last 24 hours (see Quenchwell pumping station on the screenshot below) and the 'waves' where there is currently active overflow. <https://www.southwestwater.co.uk/.../storm-overflow-map>



A plea – please think before leaving your books!

As some of the defibs are located in the phonebox book swaps please only leave books on the shelves, if the shelves are full please take your books to a charity shop – there have been instances of books (and DVDs, jigsaws etc.!) being piled up on the floor of them and in an emergency this makes it harder for someone to reach the defibrillator.

The primary purpose of the phoneboxes is to house the defibrillators.

The bookswaps are not places for books (if the shelves are full) or other things you are trying to get rid of to be dumped, they are a community facility provided by the Parish Council and we have volunteers who help to keep them tidy but we don't feel it is fair to expect them to have to dispose of surplus books or other items that have been dumped there.

Please have some consideration for others when using these facilities. The Parish Council will be discussing the housing of the defibrillators and provision of bookswaps at their September Access & Amenities Committee meeting.

The Parish Council submit consultee comments on planning applications in the Parish and these are discussed at Planning Committee meetings and if a multi-dwelling development or due to deadlines for comment, at a Full Parish Council meeting.

Details of any planning applications received for consultee comment will be posted on the Parish Council's website on the 'Current Planning Applications' page www.feockpc.com/current-planning-applications and our Facebook page.

Please be aware that Cornwall Council no longer display yellow site notices on planning application sites unless they affect a public right of way, listed building or are in a Conservation Area so to be aware of what is going on in the area check our Current Planning Applications page or set up an alert on Cornwall Council's planning page as shown on the next page.

If you're thinking of making a planning application on your property we always recommend that applicants read our Feock Neighbourhood Development Plan to make themselves aware of the local planning policies. Vacancies on the Parish Council

Would you like to make a difference?

Devoran (2 positions) and Carnon Downs (1 position)

Feock Parish Council has three vacancies, one in the Carnon Downs ward and two in Devoran ward for Parish Councillors, which is planned to fill by co-option at the September and/or October meetings.

There is so much to get involved in from reviewing planning applications, helping with making improvements to footpaths and recreation areas, highways issues and our wellbeing work to name but a few! You will also be required to attend the Parish Council meetings which generally take place on the first or second Monday evening of the month in Devoran, you can also join other Committees such as Planning and Access & Amenities if you wish.

To become a Councillor you must:

- Be a British or a citizen of the Commonwealth. You may also be eligible as a citizen of the European Union, however the criteria has changed now that the UK has left the European Union. Please check on the gov.uk website for advice about EU citizens' voting and candidacy rights in local elections; and be at least 18 years old.
- be an elector of the parish; or
- in the past 12 months have occupied (as owner or tenant) land or other premises in the parish; or
- work in the parish (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the parish boundary.

Please note, being a Parish Councillor is a voluntary position and we would recommend people who are interested attend a Parish Council or Committee meeting before applying to gain an understanding of the issues you will be involved with.

The next meetings are: Monday 9th September at 6pm (Full Council), Access & Amenities Committee on Monday 23rd September at 6pm and Monday 14th October at 6pm (Full Council)

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please send an email or letter of application explaining why you would like to join the Parish Council, what you can bring to the Council and any previous relevant experience, to the Parish Clerk by **Wednesday 9th October 2024**. 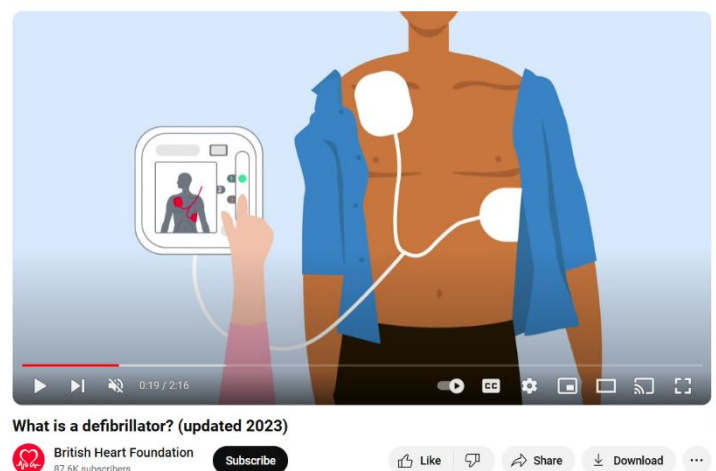

Defibrillators in the Parish

There are a number of public access defibrillators around the parish, these are automated, anyone can use one, training is not necessary. The defibrillator will talk the user through how to use it and will not allow a shock to be given unless it detects that the heart is in a shockable rhythm. The defibrillators are located as follows:

- Phonebox on Market Street, Devoran
